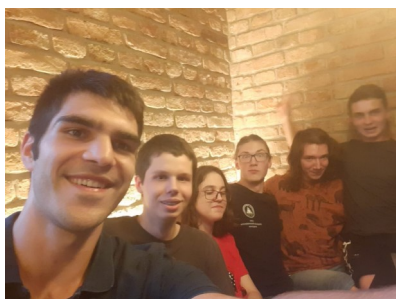
Arrivals

Tales from Zagreb



Bloody Bridge as seen today

Krvavi most (lit. "Bloody Bridge") is a street in the heart of Zagreb. It is named after the former bridge over the Medveščak creek, which was rendered useless after the covering of the creek. Although the bridge became the street, the name stayed because of historical reasons – as a reminder of history and a witness of Zagreb's past.

The bridge gained its name because of the constant 400-year-conflicts happening on its wooden beams between the citizens of the two parts of Zagreb: Gradec and present day Kaptol. Most well-known Croatian female novelist Marija Jurić Zagorka wrote one of her best novels (Tajna krvavog mosta; Secrets of the Bloody Bridge) which was inspired by the events on that bridge.

According to legend, the whole Zagreb area was suffering from drought. To give people and animals something to drink, an old Christian duke plunged his sword into dry earth and saw fresh water bubble up. He called out to his soldiers: „Zagrabite!“ („Scoop up!“), then he repeated to the girl who stood close by: „Manda dear, scoop up some water!“ The spring, which still stands on the main square, got the name Manduševac after the girl and Zagreb got its name after the scoop of water.
